WEEK THREE: REJOICE IN THE LORD ~ THE LIGHT IS NEAR

The Scriptures of the Third Sunday of Advent:

The First Reading: Isaiah 61: 1-2a, 10-11

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me;" "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul." Isaiah rejoices in the Lord, even as he finds joy as he is sent to proclaim glad tidings and the time of favor and vindication.

The Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-24

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing." "May the God of peace make you perfectly holy." Paul calls for the entire person (body, spirit, soul) to be preserved blameless for the coming of the Lord.

The Gospel: John 1: 6-8, 19-28

"A man named John was sent from God." "He was not the light, but came to testify to the light." He proclaimed: "I am the voice of one crying in the desert, make straight the way of the Lord." John announces the coming of Christ.

Advent Reflections by Father Tom:

The words of the Scriptures jump from the pages of this sacred book this week and evoke the images of salvation and joy. Isaiah speaks the words that Jesus himself will later proclaim as he begins his public ministry and the words that Mary will later echo in her magnificat. These are words of Spirit and joy. These are words of mission and hope. These are images of salvation by our God and cause for joy. These are words of glad tidings, favor and vindication, as we prepare for the coming of the Lord. How enlightening and how awesome. The good news, the glad tidings of the angels echo this joy in their announcement of the birth of the Savior to shepherds in the hills, a message to all and to the common person, not the wealthy and privileged. Glad tidings that a Savior is born.

We, the latter day crowds, hear the cry of John the Baptist, the time of his coming is near. We, the latter day shepherds, hear the song of the angels, the glad tidings, the good news, that a Savior is born. We, the common people, not the wealthy and the privileged, rejoice in salvation in his name. We prepare by praying without ceasing as we rejoice in the power of Christ to make us perfectly holy and to preserve us as blameless in his blood as we await his return. Yes, the light is near and we need not embrace the darkness for we are children of the light. Challenged and even opposed, we are strengthened and enlightened for the journey, even as we await his return in glory. We celebrate with joy and inner peace, the coming of our God, in Jesus Christ. As we await his return, we are made new and perfected in his Spirit. This is great cause to rejoice heartily in the Lord as we too are sent forth into the world to proclaim his glad tidings, his Good News, by our words and in our deeds.

Humbly, we walk with God as we walk in the light of Christ. Like John, we announce the coming of Christ. Like John we are the voices in the desert calling all to prepare for the coming of the Lord. We are not the one, but we point to the one. By Baptism in water and the Holy Spirit, we are his Living Body, pointing to him, testifying to all, that we have been saved and await the fullness of joy on the day of his return.

We remember and give thanks for our salvation and as we await his Second Coming, even as we prepare to mark the celebration of his Birth. Truly we find joy in God, our Savior. "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice."

DEACON SPEAKIN'



My sisters and brothers, I would like you to meet John the Baptist, the cousin of our Lord Jesus Christ. St. John could have started today's gospel just like that, but he didn't. He thought it was important for us, the followers of Jesus Christ, to know this man. This is the

same man Jesus Himself described as the greatest man ever born of a woman. So who is this man, John the Baptist? Today's gospel tells us that "he came to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was NOT the light, but came to testify to the light." His life put the focus on Jesus, the light of the world. While fulfilling his mission, John the Baptist attracted a lot of followers, one of which we know was the soon to be apostle, Andrew. These followers were very taken by his message of redemption from a dark and sinful world, so that he became very popular with a large number of loyal followers. In fact, he was so popular and so effective, that his followers wanted to believe that he was the light promised in the writings of Isaiah. When Jesus finally appeared on earth, John knew that his mission was completed. He knew that he had to fade out of the salvation scene and let Jesus complete His work. From a human standpoint, after many years of hard work, John had created a great following. Now, still in his prime, had to give it up...or rather surrender it to Jesus. The spotlight that was on John now had to go to Jesus.

We, the followers of Jesus Christ, have a mission similar to John the Baptist. Jesus told us that we are the light of the world and have to let our light shine in a dark world that is getting even darker. At the same time that we are the light, we, like John the Baptist, have to surrender that light, shift it to Jesus and always give the glory to God. However, when you look at world headlines, crime in our own neighborhoods, pastors getting robbed in their own bedrooms, and all of the ever increasing greed in corporate America, self-centeredness in our governmental leaders and the celebration of immorality in our culture, the world seems to be getting darker. It will continue to grow dark until we turn on the light. If we, the Christian community, were taking our responsibility to be the light, things could change. A new and different world would come to light if we start imitating John the Baptist and testify to Jesus with all the actions of our life. Fewer and fewer of our brothers would be lost in the darkness of poverty, injustice, abortion, and moral decay. The old and the simple people would be valued, instead of disdained. There would be no way to rationalize the need for war. Greed and hoarding would be futile. Oppression and aggression in the world, and in our personal lives, would be things of the past. As long as the world remains dark, the "blind" have to grope around in the darkness of greed, sin, sexual immorality, anger, aggression etc. Let us use this Advent season 2011 and the introduction to St. John the Baptist, as a motivator to turn on the light that may have dimmed, and put it on in its brightest setting, so that through us, a dark world can see the light, and we can all bask in the peace and joy that comes from it.
