

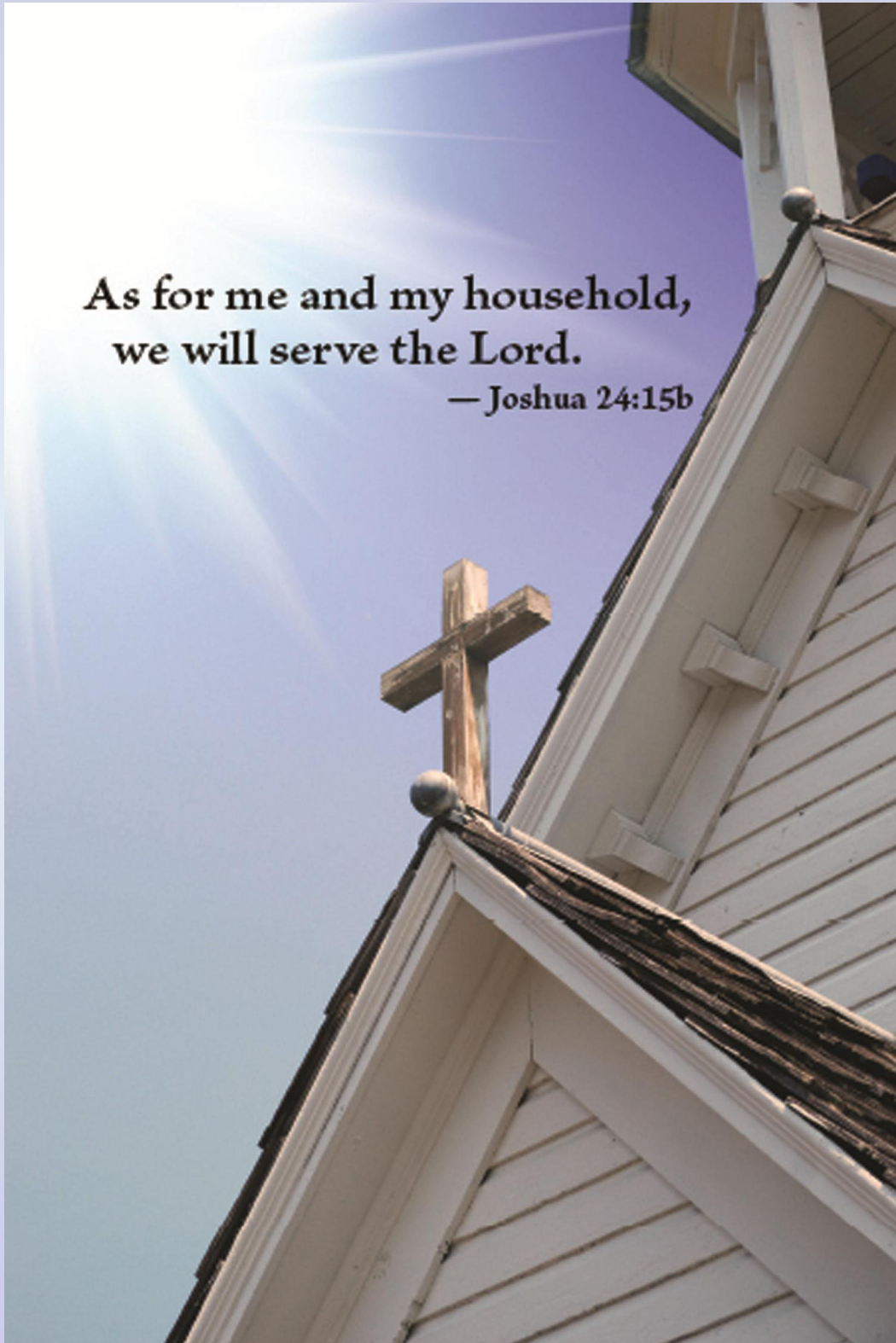

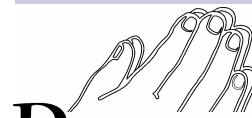

SPRED the News

SPRED: Special Religious Development is for individuals ages 6-96 who have disabilities such as Cerebral Palsy, severe epilepsy, Autism etc.. who can't attend a regular classroom setting to learn about our faith.

There are 4 age groups: 6-10 years old, 11-16 years old, 17-21 years, old and 22 and older. The program runs September through May. Our SPRED group meets on Monday evenings in the Wagner and O'Neill Rooms. We currently have 2 openings for friends and 2 openings for catechists as well. We host the 17-21 age group.

We are excited to announce our involvement with this year's parish Fall Fest (September 28-October 1). The school will host a "Knight Out" on the evening of Saturday, September 29th.

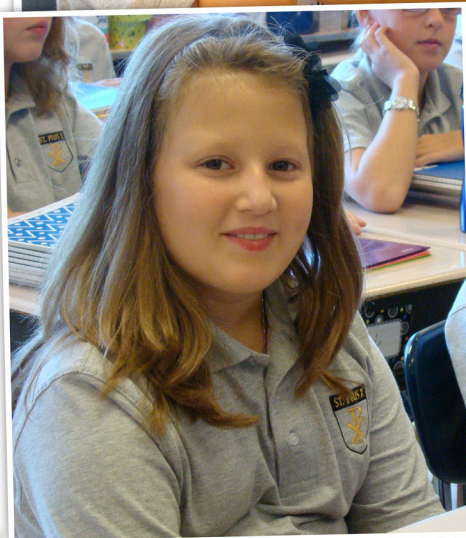

HAY QUE ELEGIR

REFLEXION

Durante todo este mes de agosto hemos estado escuchando, del evangelio de Juan, el discurso de Jesús sobre el Pan de Vida. Un discurso que comenzó con la multiplicación de los panes y los peces y que termina hoy. Y hoy, al finalizar, después de haber escuchado a Jesús, es el momento de la elección, hay que elegir.

Jesús se presenta como el Mesías que viene de Dios y que trae la Palabra y el Espíritu que pueden dar VIDA a aquellos que lo acojan. “Las palabras que os he dicho son espíritu y vida”, nos dice. Jesús nos invita a acogerle a Él, renunciando a “otros dioses”. Es la opción que hace el pueblo de Israel en la asamblea de Siquén (1ª lectura). Josué les plantea: “escoged hoy a quién queréis servir”. Y el pueblo se compromete a servir al Señor. Es una decisión que nace de la libertad, pero también del sentirse agradecidos al Dios que les ha sacado de la esclavitud de Egipto y que los acompaña en su caminar.

Y es la misma elección que tienen que hacer los discípulos en el evangelio. Y también la que hemos hecho nosotros, como discípulos de Jesús. Si en la primera lectura las cosas están claras, en el evangelio aparecen las dudas. “Este modo de hablar es duro”. Es la primera reacción de los que le escuchan. Lo que Jesús plantea no es estar de acuerdo con una serie de afirmaciones o criterios, sino una manera de vivir. Y es legítimo que aparezcan dudas a la hora de elegir, y más si se trata de una opción tan fundamental como esta. En el fondo, estamos planteando si queremos vivir bajo los valores de la entrega, la generosidad, la fidelidad, el amor, el perdón, la justicia, etc... o si preferimos dejarnos llevar por el materialismo, el consumismo, el poseer, el interés propio, la corrupción... Hay que elegir.

Jesús da varios criterios para ayudar en la elección. El primero de ellos es cuando dice: “el espíritu es quien da vida; la carne no sirve de nada”. Se trata de vivir encerrados en uno mismo y en el egoísmo, o abiertos a la vida y al espíritu. Y en segundo lugar,

dice Jesús: “nadie puede venir a mí, si el Padre no se lo concede”. Por eso decimos que la fe es un don que hay que acoger. El Padre nos la ofrece y en nuestras manos y en nuestra libertad está acogerla, acoger a Jesús y su estilo de vida, u optar por otros estilos, por “otros dioses”.

“Muchos discípulos suyos se echaron atrás y no volvieron a ir con él”. Es una elección, totalmente respetable, y que nace de la libertad de los hijos de Dios. Pero ahora viene la pregunta para nosotros: “¿también vosotros queréis marcharos?”. La respuesta de Pedro es atrevida: “tú tienes palabras de vida eterna”. Y esa elección le llevará hasta dar la vida, al estilo de Jesús. A nosotros quizás no se nos pida llegar hasta esos extremos, pero sí que la vida de cada día nos va pidiendo pequeñas entregas, pequeñas opciones, decisiones, exigencias, compromisos que van formando nuestro estilo de vida en la medida en que vamos respondiendo, en la medida en que nos dejamos llevar por el Espíritu y por la Palabra de Vida que Jesús nos ofrece.

Jesús es el Pan de la Vida. La Eucaristía es el alimento que nos fortalece en nuestra entrega, en nuestra fe, en nuestra opción por Jesús y su Evangelio. Que no nos falte nunca en nuestra vida para que podamos optar por un estilo de vivir en el que tengamos en cuenta a nuestros hermanos, especialmente a los que sufren y a los más necesitados.

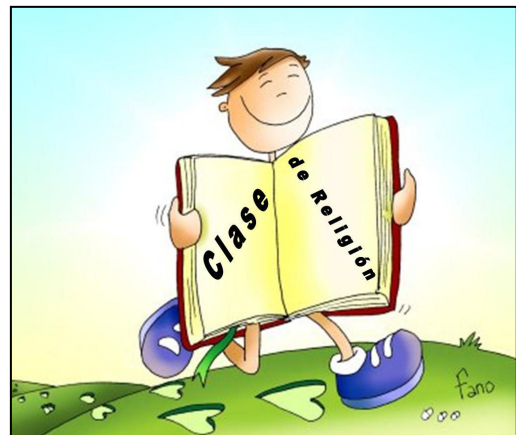
