NECESITAMOS LA AYUDA DE DIOS

Ponemos nuestra confianza en el Señor. Si el domingo pasado Jesús nos recordaba que tenemos que dar gracias en nuestra oración por los dones que Dios nos regala, hoy nos recuerda que también es bueno pedir. La verdad es que no hace falta que nos recuerde que pidamos, pues es lo que hacemos habitualmente, más difícil nos resulta dar gracias. Sin embargo, también es bueno pedir, por eso Jesús cuenta la parábola del juez inicuo para explicar cómo tenemos que orar siempre sin desanimarnos. Al pedir reconocemos nuestra limitación y ponemos nuestra confianza en Dios. La fe sostiene nuestra esperanza y el convencimiento de que Dios está a favor vuestro, está de nuestra parte. Como dice San Agustín, "la fe es la fuente de la oración, no puede fluir el río cuando se seca el manantial del agua". Es decir, quien pide es porque cree y confía que Dios "hace justicia a sus elegidos". Pero, al mismo tiempo, la oración alimenta nuestra fe, por eso le pedimos a Dios que "avude nuestra incredulidad". Proclamemos confiadamente con el Salmo: "El auxilio me viene del Señor, que hizo el cielo y la tierra".

Comprometernos con lo que pedimos. Ocurre que frecuentemente no sabemos pedir y nos decepcionamos si Dios no nos concede lo que pedimos. No puede ser que Dios conceda a todos acertar el número de la lotería y es imposible que conceda a la vez la victoria a dos aficionados de dos equipos distintos que se enfrentan entre sí. Dios no es un talismán, o un mago que nos soluciona los problemas. Cuando pedimos algo nos implicamos en eso que pedimos y nos comprometemos con lo que suplicamos. Por ejemplo, si pedimos por la paz nos estamos comprometiendo nosotros mismos en ser pacíficos v constructores de paz. Lo otro es pedir a Dios que nos saque las castañas del fuego sin mover nosotros un solo dedo. Jesús nos anima a perseverar en la oración con insistencia, pues entonces estamos demostrando nuestra total confianza en Dios. Pero no pidamos imposibles, no podemos obligar a Dios a alterar el ritmo de la naturaleza. Pidamos mejor que sepamos aceptar nuestras limitaciones y sobre todo sabiduría para asumir lo que no

podemos cambiar. Cuando llega el dolor o la enfermedad tan importante es pedir la curación como aceptación y confianza serena ante la enfermedad.

Oración comunitaria. No cabe duda de que la oración en común tiene más sentido y me atrevería a decir que más fuerza. En el momento de las preces de la Eucaristía alguien lee o presenta la petición y todos nos unimos a él/ella diciendo "¡Te rogamos óyenos!". Hemos de pedir no sólo por nosotros o por los nuestros, sino también por todos los que lo necesitan. No olvidemos que somos el cuerpo de Cristo y cuando un miembro sufre, todo el cuerpo sufre. A veces las peticiones que hacemos en la Eucaristía resultan demasiado formalistas o rutinarias. Deberíamos dejar campo a la espontaneidad y dar oportunidad para que el que quiera exprese su necesidad para unirnos en su oración. Es verdad que Dios conoce lo que necesitamos antes de que se lo pidamos, también un padre sabe lo que necesita su hijo, pero le gusta que se lo diga, pues es señal de confianza en él. Dios te dice cada día: "si me pides, soy don para ti; si me necesitas, te digo: estoy aquí, dentro de ti".

En la era del teléfono móvil te voy a mostrar ocho reglas para hablar con Dios:

- *1.- Marca el prefijo correcto, no a lo loco.
- ***2.-** Una conversación telefónica con Dios no es un monólogo. No hables sin parar, escucha al que te habla desde el otro lado.
- ***3.-** Si la conversación se interrumpe, comprueba si has sido tú el causante del "corte".
- ***4.-** No adoptes la costumbre de llamar sólo en casos de urgencia. Eso no es trato de amigos.
- *5.- No seas tacaño. No llames sólo a horas de "tarifa reducida"; es decir, cuando toca o en fines de semana. Una llamada breve en cualquier momento del día sería ideal.
- *6.- Las llamadas son gratuitas y no pagan impuestos.
- *7.- No olvides decirle a Dios que te deje en el contestador todos los mensajes que quiera o cuando quiera.
- ***8.-** Toma nota de las indicaciones que Él te diga para que no las eches en olvido




